## 2021 Report Card on Child &amp; Youth Sex Trafficking

Issue	Grade	Score	Highlights
 1. Criminal Provisions	<b>B</b>	<b>15</b> 17.5	Policy goals accomplished in areas related to buyer accountability under the trafficking law, buyer and trafficker accountability under state CSEC laws, and decoy defenses. Gaps remain in areas related to mistake of age defenses, business entity liability under the trafficking law, and financial penalties.
 2. Identification of and Response to Victims	<b>F</b>	<b>12</b> 27.5	Policy goals accomplished in areas related to third party control and child abuse definitions. Gaps remain in areas related to foreign national victims, screening through child welfare and the juvenile justice system, non-criminalization for prostitution offenses, expanded non-criminalization, juvenile court jurisdiction, and non-familial trafficking cases.
 3. Continuum of Care	<b>F</b>	<b>7</b> 15	Policy goal accomplished related to extended foster care services. Gaps remain in areas related to services through a non-punitive system, MDT responses, services through the juvenile justice system, and appropriations.
 4. Access to Justice for Trafficking Survivors	<b>D</b>	<b>9</b> 15	Policy goals accomplished in areas related to restitution and civil remedies. Gaps remain in areas related to civil orders of protection, crime victims' compensation, vacatur, and statutes of limitation.
 5. Tools for a Victim-Centered Criminal Justice Response	<b>F</b>	<b>4</b> 10	Gaps remain in all areas, including hearsay exceptions, alternatives to live, in-court testimony, victim supports, and privileged communications.
 6. Prevention and Training	<b>C</b>	<b>11.5</b> 15	Policy goals accomplished in areas related to training for prosecutors and school personnel as well as prevention education in schools. Gaps remain in areas related to training for child welfare, juvenile justice agencies, and law enforcement.
<b>EXTRA CREDIT</b>	 Youth	<b>1</b>	Protection related to civil remedies is extended to sex trafficked youth.
	 Child Labor Trafficking	<b>2</b>	Protections related to restitution and civil remedies are extended to child labor trafficking victims.
